WE NEED YOUR HELP & SUPPORT

Your child's absence from school not only impacts on their lost opportunity to learn, but impacts the school too.

At the end of term of the autumn term our school's attendance dropped to 94.8%, this is below the Department for Education (DFE) expectation of 96%.

Please be aware that it is your responsibility as the parent or carer, to ensure that your child attends school every day. Whilst your child is in school, you know that they are constantly learning, achieving, aspiring and enjoying this vital part of their development. Please don't take this opportunity away from them by not bringing them into school.

If your child is ill, please ensure that you maintain regular contact with the school office so that they are aware of the circumstances and so that your child's attendance record is kept up to date. Where possible obtain medical evidence e.g. prescription or appointment card.

Melanie Jago is our Attendance Family Liaison Worker. She works to improve attendance and follows up absences from school by contacting our parents and completing home visits.

As attendance is statutory, we all have a duty to ensure that children are in school every day (unless of course they are very ill). Melanie hopes to work with you in making this possible.

Hopefully, by supporting families to ensure that children are attending school regularly, there will be fewer referrals to the Education Welfare Officer.

We would also like to remind you that is against school policy and government guidelines to take holiday during the school term.

If there is no improvement in your child's attendance then a request for service will be made to the Education Welfare Service which could result in the issuing of a Penalty Notice or prosecution. Penalty Notices are set at £60 if paid by 21 days and £120 if paid between 22 and 28 days. Any legal proceedings would relate to section 444(1) or 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996.
