





Knowledge organisers will be sent home every half term.

Knowledge organisers allow children (and families) to start learning about their new topic and contain timelines, key knowledge and high quality pictures.

Reading in Year 6

It is vital that all children read at least 4 times a week

- > Children must log their home reading on the online reading diary https://forms.office.com/r/v3LLDWhNhC . Their reading diary will be checked and their book changed (if needed) once per week.
- ➤ Please support your children to record their reading in their diary. There is space for adults to sign the diary and to add comments.
- ➤ Children will receive a "Book Token" for every time they have read at home and the teacher has seen evidence in the reading diary. When they reach 50, 75 or 100 tokens they are able to purchase a book from our Book Shop!
- ➤ Children who do not read 4 times may have to attend our playtime reading club.

> Children are regularly assessed to ensure they are reading within the correct book band. Remember that children may be fluent at 'decoding' the words on the page, but also need to be confident with their comprehension skills to move up to the

next band.







Home Learning

Key Dates and Times

Your child will take part in PE sessions every Thursday afternoon.
